He has written hundreds of songs with the young people at The 52nd St. Project over the years and continues to be inspired each time he sets foot in the building. Outside of The Project, Avi is a sought-after collaborator in theater, film, dance, and experiential art.

Recent work includes music, songs, and sound design for projects with: Ars Nova, Disney, Hulu, The O'Neill, Oregon Shakespeare Festival, New York Theater Workshop, The New Victory, PlayCo, The Public Theater, and Tribeca Film Festival, among others. 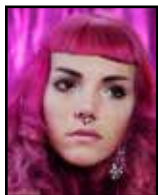

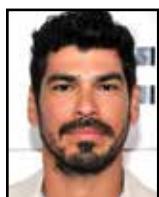

As a playwright her work has been featured by Project Y, Classical Theater of Harlem, InViolet Theater, and others. She is a former member of Project Y's Playwriting Group. Her play, "Tallahassee" was a semi-finalist for the O'Neill Playwright's Conference. Recently, "How Can I Help You?", a 2021 semi-finalist for Seven Devils Playwright's Conference, was workshopped at Pioneer Theater in Salt Lake City, Utah. Kaaron is also an accomplished actor, having performed on stages in London and Moscow, as well as on screen. She often works with Little Lord and the Working Theater. She has directed for various organizations around New York, as well as the Playwright's Center in Minnesota. A member of AEA, SAG-AFTRA, and the Dramatists Guild, she is also a proud member of The 52nd Street Project community. Kaaron is a New Orleans native with an MFA from ART/MXAT/IATT at Harvard University.



BILL CAMP (*Bucket, NOT MY SPRINKLES by Julian*) is best known for his Emmy-nominated performance in HBO's critically acclaimed limited series "The Night Of" as well as his SAG-nominated performance as Mr. Shaibel in the hit Netflix limited series "The Queen's Gambit." A veteran of the stage, Camp received a 2016 Tony Award nomination for his performance as Reverend John Hale in Arthur Miller's *The Crucible*, directed by Ivo Van Hove. He also received a Drama Desk nomination for his role as Charley in Mike Nichols's production of *Death of a Salesman* (Tony Award for Best Revival). Additional theater credits include *Coram Boy*, *Heartbreak House*, *Jackie*, *The Seagull*. Off-Broadway: *Homebody/Kabul* (Obie Award winner), *The Misanthrope*, *Olly's Prison*. Camp is a graduate of the Juilliard School. 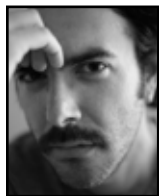
