

5. Naseem Abdul-Majeed makes his feelings known.


6. Maria and Kylee played a couple with some relationship issues.



- What she does for us- Lynne first volunteered with us in 2011 and has worked for us over the years as an actor, a director, an improv teacher, an artist, a coach for Teen Ensemble and Storytelling, and a stellar long-time Smart Partner to Sarah Lopez.
- Occupation- "I wear a lot of hats professionally: I'm the creator and host of a TV show called Famous Cast Words, a teacher at NYU Tisch/Playwrights Horizons Theater School, currently a research fellow at Maynooth University in Ireland, a visual artist, writer, and an occasional co-facilitator of anti-bias and anti-oppression trainings. Oh, and in theory I'm still an actor, but mostly only at The Project these days."
- Why she does what she does- "I like to think about being an oyster in everything I do. Oysters can live in toxic water and filter it. Not only do they make the water better for everyone else, they're actually served by the act of filtration, they get nutrients from it. There's a lot in the world that is toxic, but by filtering my tiny patch of the oyster bed, I am nourished."
