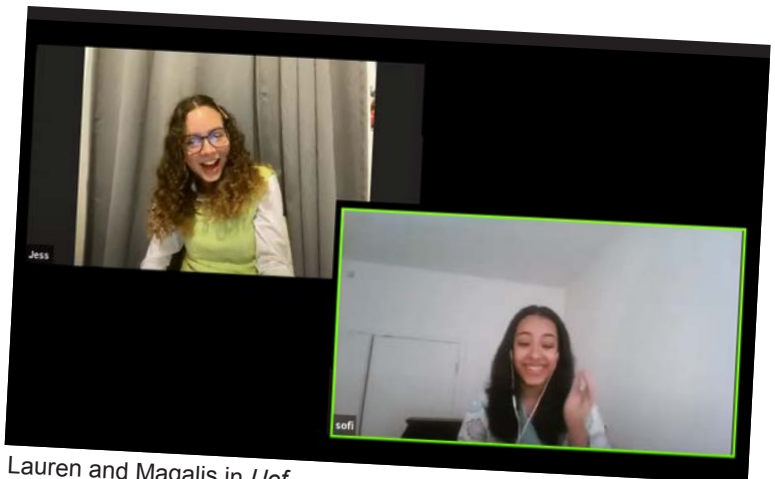

The 52nd Street Project is a non-profit organization that brings children from the Hell's Kitchen neighborhood together with professional theater artists to create original theater. **WALKING ON SUNSHINE** is a production of our Playmaking program. Young people participated in a playwriting course taught by Kat Almirañez or Garrett Kim and adapted for the Project by Daniel Judah Sklar from his book *Playmaking: Children Writing and Performing Their Own Plays*. At the end of the course, each child was matched with two actors and a dramaturg/director who guided him or her through the writing of a play. This performance is the end result.

This edition marks the in-person return of children to The 52nd Street Project Clubhouse and The Five Angels Theater. We normally would have taken the students to the country, but this is not possible yet. However, we are delighted and grateful to be working with them in a live, present way.

Over the seven weeks of Songmaking, led by Avi Amon and Program Director Garrett David Kim, these young lyricists explore how their own words and ideas fit together with their composer’s music to create songs. Near the end of the program, we bring in a company of singers to perform the completed songs, and share them with an audience.

Young people participated in a playwriting course taught by **Kat Almirañez** and adapted for the Project by **Daniel Judah Sklar** from his book *Playmaking: Children Writing and Performing Their Own Plays*. At the end of the course, each child was matched with two actors and a dramaturg/director who guided him or her through the writing of a play. This performance is the end result.

This edition continues our in-person return of children to **The 52nd Street Project Clubhouse** and **The Five Angels Theater**. We normally would have taken the students to the country, but this is not possible yet. However, we are delighted and grateful to be working with them in a live, present way.

The 52nd Street Project is a non-profit organization that brings children from the Hell's Kitchen neighborhood together with professional theater artists to create original theater. **FOOD FOR THOUGHT** is a production of our Playmaking program. - ...I'm so scared and uncomfortable to the point where words refuse to leave my mouth.
- ...I'm speaking and nobody is listening, it's basically the same thing as saying nothing at all.
- ...I am underwater.

I am speechless when...

- ...There is no point in speaking if you do not believe nor understand what you are saying. I like to talk but don't like to say a bunch of nothing.
- ...People bring up trauma as a joke. (I don't know if I should laugh.)
- ...Helping someone grieve.
- ...I'm listening.

- ...Something unexpected happens.
- ...Finding out a secret you weren't supposed to see or hear.
- ...Confused about something.
- ...Witnessing the most stunning vision, and the most harmful atrocities.
- ...I look around and see all these people with their own lives and individuality.
- ...When I am hurt, physically or emotionally.

I choose to be speechless when...

- ...I am trying to learn and educate myself on something I don't know about or when I have nothing to contribute or say in that specific moment.
- ...People are laughing but nothing is funny.
- ... I am focused.
- ...Watching a movie/ show/ performance.
- ...Someone says something I don't agree with, but I don't want to spend energy rebutting it.
- ...I want to say something but feel as if nobody will agree.
- ...I witness a brutal act, rather than speak of it, I turn into yet another silent bystander.
- ...I need a moment to collect myself and my thoughts, sometimes silence is the most beautiful calming sound.
