





In the summer 2023, she was tricked into acting by Kat Almirañez for the improvised play *Now We're Here*, in

which she played a star-struck fan-girl-turned-stalker. Some have claimed she was not in fact acting, just playing an exaggerated version of herself, but Adaire refutes those claims. She and her smart partner, Katty, appeared in the Projeast episode #43 "My Amazing Ice Cream Achievement," in which they explored a wide array of topics, including their participation in the Project's Amazing Race competition.
