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ONE TASTY PRODUCTION

In a Playmaking production, the young people write their first plays guided by adult volunteers. The shows are then set to music, designed and performed by adult professionals. The December production, *SUGAR & SPICE, Plays to Savor*, featured 8 zesty shows with original music by **Avi Amon**, lighting design by **Finn Meyercord**, sound design by **Hannah Birch Carl**, and costume design by **Christianne Bakewell**. **Charlie Zuckerman** was our seasoned stage manager.

Kelvyn Mitchell turned out to be Penelope G.'s *THE MAN IN THE BLUE SHIRT*, much to the dismay of poison ivy plant **Natalie Walker**, who only wanted her best friend returned to her. **Betsy Hogg** was the dramaturge/director.

A ballerina (**Keren Lugo**) runs into a car salesman (**Neil D'Astolfo**) on the street, and she instantly believes he's her long lost brother in Chad B.' *THE LOST FAMILY*, which was dramaturged and directed by **Marchánt Davis**.

Matt P.'s *THE DOJO* was set in a fridge, where an egg (**Yonatan Gebeyehu**) has a battle with a mustard container (**Nadia Quinn**), and only the least delicious survive. **Nolan Doran** was the dramaturge/ director.

The best puppy in the world (**Shaunette Renée Wilson**) and 11 year-old soccer star Bob (**Ross Cowan**) team up in Dylan L.'s *THE STORY OF LYLA & BOB*, with dramaturgy and direction by **Michael Propster**.



Kaylee G. brought us Cathren & Jake (**Stephanie Linas & JJ Wilks**) as *THE SISTER & THE BROTHER*, struggling to connect despite some birthday pranks that threaten to upend their relationship. **Kea Trevett** was the dramaturge/director.

In Kaylie M.'s *DIFFERENT WORLDS DIFFERENT DREAMS*, a pigeon and a deer (**Jackie Chung & Cecilia Arana**) meet in a forest and team up to take on the deer's abusive stepdad, who is not a deer at all. **Ka-Ling Cheung** was the dramaturge/director.

A trainer (**Arian Moayed**) claims to want to help basketball player (**Joe Holt**) do well enough to gain back his family, but the trainer turns out to be Zaire B.'s *THE PARENT THIEF*, dramaturgy and direction by **Christian DeMarais**.

Piper (**Adrienne C. Moore**) seems unable to get her mother Alena (**Celia Keenan-Bolger**) to be kind to her, but why? That's Lalune L.'s *THE MYSTERY*, with dramaturgy and direction by **Annabelle Cousins**.

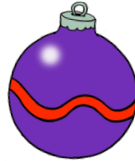


HO-HO-HOLIDAY PARTY

TAKE DOWN, Stage Combat 2026 presented 7 such scenes, with lighting design by **Stuart Green**, sound design by **Bri Weintraub**, and stage management by **Amy Tedeschi**.

PANDA'S JOURNEY FOR A CROWBAR, by Project member Naseem, with director/dramaturge **Jose Gamo**, told the tale of Poma the Panda (**Jon-Michael Reese**) and Hard Elephant (**Gardiner Comfort**) who need to find an enchanted crowbar in order to defeat the evil No, a dinosaur (**Anna Crivelli**).



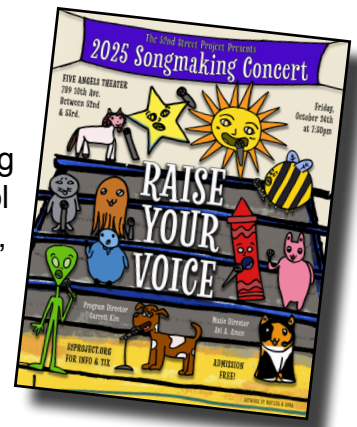

GIVING VOICE

Songmaking is the process by which the young people learn about creating songs and collaborate with graduate students and alumni of NYU's Tisch School of the Arts Musical Theater Writing Program, and BerkleeNYC's Power Station, to create original works that are presented in a free concert each fall. This year, RAISE YOUR VOICE was presented Friday, October 24, in our Five Angels Theater, led by Program Director **Garrett Kim**, Music Director **Avi A. Amon**, Stage Manager & Lighting Designer **Bri Weintraub**, and Sound Designer **Elisabeth Weidner**. The amazing band was **Stephen Stocking**, guitars; **Danny Ursetti**, drums; and **Sam Weber**, bass.



1 The first set of three songs had lyrics by Atif, with music by **Ben Page** [1]. In "The Deep Blue of the Birds," **Yonatan Gebeyehu** [2] was a bird who had lost his family to the ocean.

Gaven Trinidad [3] was "The Master of RPS," about a young man cautiously confident in his Rock, Paper, Scissors skills.

In "The Fight for the Height," **Andy Ingalls** [4] was a building hoping to become taller and more powerful than a mean skyscraper.



Next up, Jaaziel presented two songs with composer **Jacinth Greywoode** [5].

Reminiscing about "Coney Island," **Neil Tyrone Pritchard** [6] described a day at the beach.



Christian DeMarais [7] sang of his dream of being a fast car in "Race Tesla."

The next pair of songs were from BreeAnna & composer **Cassidy O'Connell** [8].

Meeting a "Little Birdie," turned out to be traumatizing for **Ali Ewoldt** [9].

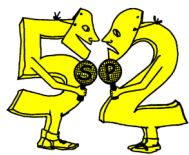

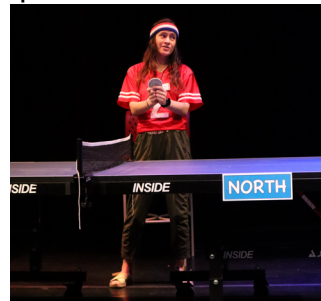
